






MAP OF LONG STREET:

INTERNATIONAL HOUSE CAPE TOWN








OVERVIEW MAP OF CAPE TOWN

· Classrooms

All our classrooms are air-conditioned, tastefully decorated and designed with comfort in mind. They are furnished with a white board, smart tv, notice board and all equipment needed to optimise teaching. Our Personal Study Programme takes place in a designated, functionally designed open classroom, facilitating interactive group and individual learning. The school currently consists of spacious classrooms plus the Personal Study Programme area and with extra premises available to us at peak times.

Reception/social and activities desk

Here students can get information about classes, times, any changes that need to be made, the right person to speak to and any general inquiries about the school and Cape Town. THINGS TO DO IN CAPE TOWN

Long Street

Vibey Long Street is a must-see, where music stores, second hand shops, boutiques of all kinds, cafés, restaurants and many clubs and bars dominate the ever-bustling 4km Long Street.

Here you will find an eclectic mix of modern and antique, fashionable and alternative, local and international shops.



Probably Cape Town's most iconic attraction is Table Mountain, where you can either hike up beautiful fynbos trails or opt for the faster cable car to the top. From the top of Table Mountain you have a spectacular view of the whole Cape Town below you. Be sure to get there early as the queues can get very long in peak season. Please check the weather before you go.



Nature

There are many Nature Reserves in and around Cape Town which are well worth a visit. Here you will see the province's abundant fauna and flora, some local antelope and buck, as well as rare majestic bird species. Kirstenbosch Gardens is a botantical garden in the Southern Suburbs where you can relax and enjoy Mother Nature's gifts on well-kept, tidy lawns.



A further attraction Cape Town is well known for is its breathtaking beaches, which are scattered all around the city. Closest to the IH Cape Town office is the hip Clifton Beach where the who's who of Cape Town gather to bronze and show off their beautiful bodies. Near-by you will find Camps Bay beach, a family friendly beach right by the shops, cafés and restaurants that make Camps Bay a popular spot. While in Camps Bay make sure to stay for delicious cocktail sundowners in one of the many buzzing bars. A further drive will take you to untouched beaches and surfer havens. It is not for nothing that Cape Town is the host of the Big Wave Africa international surfing competition.

Outdoor Activities

For the adrenalin junkies Cape Town boasts a wide variety of sports and extreme sports. You can go shark cage diving and scuba diving, enjoy some big wave surfing and waterskiing and even make the most of the awesome winds for some windsurfing. Mountain biking and 4x4 routes are very popular activities due to the many scenic paths and wonderdul natural routes to choose from. Kloofing and abseiling are adrenalin-pumping hikes that take you to your limit, leading you through waterfalls and meter-high jumps into rock pools and icy rivers, those that are too high to jump down you can abseil down. On the more relaxing side, Cape Town offers some of the most remarkable Golf courses in the world. Right by the ocean or at the foot of Table Mountain, you can choose the kind of scenic beauty you would like to tee off in.

Hout Bay to Simon's Town

Hout Bay used to be a small fishing village and has now become a booming suburb where you can stroll along the waterfront, take a dip in the sea, enjoy the beach or check out the many restaurants. craft markets, galleries and shops. Take the breathtaking route that is Chapman's Peak drive from Hout Bay all the way to Simon's Town. Along this scenic drive you will see an awe-inspiring view of mountain cliffs plummeting into the ocean below you. Continue your drive through Noordhoek, Fish Hoek, Kalk Bay and Simon's Town. These fishing villages have become little gems where you can browse through antique stores, galleries, museums, art and crafts stalls all day long and soak up the local arts and culture.

Other day trips which are a must-see when visiting Cape Town include
Cape Point and the Cape of
Good Hope with breathtaking views.
Robben Island where Nelson Mandela was imprisoned for 27 years is an inspiring trip to take. Other highlights are Cape Agulhas, the most southern point of Africa and a township tour where you can get an insider's look into the life and culture that makes up the vibey townships.

At every corner you can find a pub, bar, restaurant or club with music, tapas, food and style to suite your after-hour nightlife needs.
Whether it be movies or theatre, a comedy bar or club, Cape Town offers all the fun under the sun.

Festivals

Every first Thursday of each month, Cape Town

celebrates First Thursdays, which is a street, art and cultural festival that happens in Cape Town's hip streets like Bree, Loop and Shortmarket Street. Bars and restaurants offer specials and galleries and boutiques are open until late at night.

Throughout the year there are various festivals and sports competitions to keep the excitement high. The annual Cape Town Fashion Week is another big event. A local favourites are the Food and Wine Festival, Franschhoek Wineland Bubbly Festival and Rocking the Daisies, to mention a few. For the more sporty there is the world-famous Argus Pick 'n Pay Cycle race that takes you across

the most scenic parts of the Mother City. The Two Ocean's Marathon is also an all-time favourite.

Shopping

What trip to any major city is complete without a full day's shopping experience?
Cape Town's funky Woodstock suburb has a vast number of factory shops for some whole sale therapy. Access Park is well worth a trip for any whole sale shopper, here you will find the best local brands at the best price and all under one roof.

The more boutique-like shopping experience will take you to places like the V&A Waterfront, Cavendish Square and Canal Walk, the three biggest malls of Cape Town. Many locals enjoying perusing through weekend flea markets such as the Hout Bay Market and Kirstenbosch Sunday Market.

Cultural tours

To learn more about our history and the many cultures that contribute to the unique identity of our country, take advantage of cultural tours such as township tours, the District Six and Bo-Kaap museums, the Slave Lodge and Robben Island.

Make sure to visit the Zeitz Museum of Contemporary Art Africa in the new Silo District.

Transportation

Transport Apps

Uber, Bolt and DiDi are very reliable, safe and cheap options to get around Cape Town and surrounds. By downloading the app, taxis can be ordered very easily and the sudent has all the driver's and trip's information. It can be paid by card through the app or in cash.

Minibuses

From Sea Point, Camps Bay, Green Point to the city centre, they can be found on most main roads. This is the local transport is a frequent service during the day but we advise the students not to take it in the evening. The average price per trip is R8-00.

MyCiti Busses

MyCiti is Cape Town's bus system. The buses work on a card system only. Cards can be purchased at various retailers around the city. Please visit **www.myciti.org.za** or ask at Reception.

Driving

South Africa has a good road network, mostly tarred and well signposted. The speed limit is $120 \, \mathrm{km/h}$ on highways and $60\text{-}80 \, \mathrm{km/h}$ within the city. If students intend on hiring a car, they should remember to keep to the LEFT hand side of the road. We recommend having an international driver's licence with you. Often drivers under 21 have difficulties hiring a car. Please ask at reception for very competitive car hire prices.

Climate

Known to some as 'sunny South Africa', we rarely experience weather extremes. The climate in the Western Cape and Cape Town is generally Mediterranean, making it one of the best year-round destinations in the world. Generally, winter is the rainy season but rainfall has decreased a lot over the last few years and Cape Town and its surrounds have become fairly dry. Cape Town is well known for having all four seasons in one day!



Flight information

For domestic flights, please check in at least 2 hours before departure. For national and international flights, please check in at least 3 hours before departure.

Baggage allowance for flights within South Africa - schedule flights: Economy class: 20 kgs plus 1 small piece of hand luggage per person. Business class: 30 kgs plus 1 small piece of hand luggage per person. Children aged 2-11 years inclusive are entitled to the same allowance. Infants under 2 years of age do not have any baggage allowance. If you exceed these weights you will be charged for excess baggage. Do not pack any valuables into your check-in luggage i.e cameras, music equipment, money, jewellery and especially medication.

We do advise "shrink wrapping" your suitcase, for added security. This is available at most large airports within South Africa.

Money matters

Banks

Banks in South Africa are generally open from 09h00 to 15h30 on weekdays and 08h30 to 11h00 on Saturdays. Most banks change all major currencies but commission can differ greatly.

American Express has branches in Cape Town Garden Centre, Nedbank is associated with American Express. First National Bank is the Visa agent. Most ATM machines will support your card but please check before using.

•VERY IMPORTANT: Please only use ATM's inside banks/mall buildings

Credit cards

All major credit cards are accepted in Southern Africa in hotels, restaurants and shops.

Currency

The unit of currency is the South African RAND (ZAR), which is divided into 100 cents. Notes are in R200, R100, R50, R20 and R10 denominations. Coins are in denominations of R5, R2, R1 and 50c, 20c, 10c.

Tax

Value Added Tax (VAT) of 15% is levied in South Africa. Overseas visitors taking goods out of South Africa are able to reclaim the VAT which they paid on these goods. Reclaiming VAT is only applicable for goods above R250 and that you are able to produce at the airport. When purchasing your products you should request a tax invoice. The shop's VAT number must appear on this invoice. Before you check in at the airport compare your invoices with the goods purchased. Once your invoices have been approved and stamped, the VAT Reclaim Office will refund you the appropriate amount. VAT Reclaim Offices are found in Johannesburg, Durban and Cape Town Airports.

Please allow plenty of time to do this. An estimate of what items cost in South Africa:

Electricity

The electricity supply is 220/230 volts AC 50 HZ. Most plugs have 3-pin or 2-pin (round). Adaptors can be purchased at local supermarkets. US-made appliances will need a transformer.

Food and water

The Western Cape's tap water is drinkable and possibly the safest and cleanest in the world. In hotels, restaurants and nightspots, the standards of hygiene and food preparation is generally top-notch. It is safe to eat fresh fruit and salads and put as much ice as you like in your drinks - a good thing, too, after a day on the beach or in the bush. Restaurants cover a wide variety of cuisines and visitors are normally very impressed with the food. The country's many cultures makes for varied traditional fare, which is worth exploring.

Medical care / hospital

We strongly recommend sufficient travel and medical insurance before arriving in the country. Private medical facilities are equal to the best in the world and in many medical disciplines. Medical services in South Africa are good in urban areas and limited elsewhere. Doctors and hospitals often require immediate cash payment, but usually accept major credit cards. Visitors are advised to bring along supplies of specialised medication they may require. Otherwise, medicine may be purchased at pharmacies and emergency pharmacies are open all night. If any students have any health problems, please ask them to inform us at reception and we can recommend the relevant doctors.

People and language

South Africa is called the Rainbow Nation because of its diverse people and cultures. This is why most South Africans are multi-lingual where English is the most-spoken language. There are 12 official languages, including English, Xhosa, Afrikaans and Zulu. The majority religion is Christian, but freedom of worship is guaranteed by the Constitution.





Crimes against people and property, particularly in cities are a regrettable fact of life throughout the world. Most parts of the country can be safely visited by tourists, provided they take basic common-sense precautions as you would apply in any major city e.g.:

- Do not accept any help at cash points and only use ATM's inside banks or buildings.
- Obtain a map and plan your routes before you set out.
- Don't carry all your essential documents and passport with you.
- Make sure you have a copy of your passport with you at all times.
- Avoid carrying large sums of money with you.
- Leave valuable jewellery, spare money and your passport in the safe in the accommodation or at our school.
- Do not to leave anything in your car when it is parked, except in the boot.
- Don't leave handbags, even in the boot.
- Do not give lifts to hitch-hikers.
- Do not walk alone in deserted areas at night.
- Do not flash photographic equipment or smartphones in the street. Most major cities run organised crime prevention programmes and "Basis Safety Tip" guidelines are available at tourism information offices. If you are in doubt as to the safety of a particular area or attraction, contact the 24hrs operational National Tourism Information and Safety Line at +27 (0)83 123 2345. This number may also be used for assistance in replacing lost documents or reporting incidents.

Standard English

Contextual lessons are balanced to ensure that students improve their ability to apply language structures (grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation) for authentic communication and improve their reading, writing, listening and speaking skills

Intensive English

These lessons will prepare students to function more confidently as they live, work and study in an increasingly English-speaking world. Lessons are highly practical and focus on further developing vocabulary, and improving listening, speaking, reading and writing skills in real-life situations. Students will also explore topics central to 21st century life.

- 2 hours of Group Standard English per week, Monday Friday
- 1 hour of PSP
- 2 hours Group Skills Focus per week, Monday Thursday

Personal Study Programme

All courses include PSP lessons which occur in the PSP area. This guided study with specially trained teachers, allows for your course to be specifically tailored to your unique requirements. Progress is recorded daily with extensive resources being available to support your learning. Your class and PSP schedule will be confirmed via email before your start date.

Business English

The core syllabus of Business English focuses on three main business functions - presentations, meetings, and social exchanges. The syllabus covers the key areas of telephoning, formal and informal meetings, presentations, negotiations, business writing and socialising withing the work environment. In addition to the core syllabus, courses are organised, as much as possible, around students' requirements and can include topics such as Communication, Management and Management Styles etc. Lessons include a focus on relevant grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation, as well as skills practice (reading, writing, speaking and listening) within a business context.

- 2 hours of Group Standard English per week, Monday Friday
- 1 hour of PSF
- 2 hours of Private Business English Focus per week, Monday Thursday

Private Tuition lessons

One-to-one lessons can be either Intensive or additional to group lessons. These are ideal for focusing on English for Specific Purposes (for example Legal English or Medical English) or on English for Academic Purposes, where teachers are able to design their lessons according to students' specific needs. Private tuition is also beneficial for further work on language (grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation) and/or skills practice (reading, writing, listening and speaking). Semi-private lessons: small groups of 2,3 and 4 can be accommodated on request.

English for Specific Purposes (ESP)

ESP (English for Specific Purposes) refers to any course where the main objectives is to focus on the specific needs of a group of learners or individuals. It centers not only on the language (grammar, lexis, register) but also the skills, discourse and genres of that specific group of learners. IH Cape Town works in line with international trends to offer a range of ESP courses. Additional courses can be designed to suit any special interest group. Student's profiles are collected prior to arrival in order to design a course which will enhance the learning experience.

- •2 hours of Group Standard English per week Monday Friday

Classes at IH Cape Town

The IH Approach

"The IH Approach is primarily a practical, eclectic and learner-centred approach that puts the emphasis on helping students achieve concrete results in their language learning, rather than meeting numerical assessment criteria or satisfying ideological requirements."

The IH Approach is based on the core principles of:

- active participation of the learner
- respect for learners' autonomy
- incorporation of authentic language and resources into learning
- intergration of all aspects of the language grammar, lexis, communication, developement
- flexibility for teachers to achieve learners' goals in a variety of ways
- responsibility of the school for supporting learners and teachers.

Our classes / our teachers

We place importance on the students' learning environment - if learners are comfortable in their learning environment, they are more open and responsive to language input. We therefore keep our class sizes small, with maximum of 14 students per class and attempt to have an appropriate balance of nationalities in each class. However, this cannot always be guaranteed.

IH Cape Town only employ teachers with an internationally recognised teaching qualification such as the IH Certificate, CELTA, Trinity TESOL, DELTA, Trinity Diploma, or equivalent.

IH Cape Town Levels and resources

English courses at IH Cape Town have clear communication objectives, based on the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR). Teachers use the objectives to prepare lessons that are interactive and which build students' confidence in using English for real world purposes. In order to move up a level, students must attend 80% of their classes and achieve the course objectives. Each course also has learner training objectives and a clear focus on helping students learn communication strategies.

We follow twelve-week cycles, with mid-course assessment after six weeks and then end-of-course assessment after a further six weeks. Students must achieve 70% or more to pass. In addition to the six week assessment cycle, cumulative and informal assessment is carried out throughout the course.

Students should take note of the preferred start dates on page 16. However, IH Cape Town has a system of continuous enrolment, which means that new students can start courses every Monday and finish every Friday.

About the lessons

Our teachers use a combination of activities and course materials to ensure that lessons are stimulating and that students get the most effective practice of the four skills of speaking, reading, writing and listening. A variety of communicative activities and language development games are used to build students' communicative competence and confidence.



IH Cape Town uses the National Geographic "Life" and "Outcomes" course books. We also have a comprehensive resource centre from which our teachers can supplement course book work with other materials.

Certificates and reports

In order to receive a certificate and course report at the end of their course, students have to attend 80% of their lessons. The Director of Studies personally checks attendance registers at the end of the week and students who risk exceeding the 20% 'allowance' are informed in writing.



Welfare

Airport transfers



IH Cape Town provides a transfer service from Cape Town International Airport for students, regardless of the time and day of arrival. We include a free pickup service if your accommodation is booked with us. At a extra cost, we can arrange for a drop off as well. After collecting their luggage, students should pass through the Customs area. Please note that the students should not change money at the airport as this takes too much time and delays the transfer service.


Booking information

Cancellation and refund policy

You may cancel your booking provided you do so in writing to Ih Cape Town, who must receive it no less than 21 days before the start date. 
Theft of Personal Injury
